THE HIVES WILL BE MANAGED BY KATY FROM THE BRITISH BEE KEEPERS ASSOCIATION AND ALTHOUGH WE HAVE PRIMARILY ORGANISED THEM FROM AN ECOLOGICAL PERSPECTIVE, WE DO HOPE TO HAVE SOME REPTON PARK HONEY FOR SALE TO RESIDENTS AT SOME POINT IN THE FUTURE. SIGNS AND A 'SOFT BORDER' WILL BE PUT IN PLACE TO ALERT RESIDENTS AND GIVE THE BEES THE SPACE AND SECURITY TO DO THEIR THING









An update from the Grounds Sub Committee



I am sure you will all agree that the grounds have been looking magnificent over the last couple of months as we come into Summer. As usually the daffodils and tulips popped up to add some colour and the cherry tree this year was better than its ever been. We are incredibly lucky to have these open, green areas to enjoy and judging by some of the photos and comments on the Facebook group, we are all very cognisant of that. 2023 has so far seen 2 grounds projects come to life. Firstly, the no-mow area is coming on a treat! Although we don't have too many flowering plants at this point, the range of grasses and foliage is impressive, and the path that Dean and the gardening team have carved through allows us to wander along and enjoy the new growth. The point of a no-mow area is to boost biodiversity and provide food and shelter for insects and pollinators like bees. Over the last few years, nearly 46% of bee colonies were lost, and it's so important that we do our bit to try and support our winged-friends. Please do consider alternatives to pesticides when managing your own gardens as this has been found to be one of the biggest causes of bee loss.


